Income property tax is on track and ahead of last year. Higher income from the result of Strike Team and Strike Team vehicle reimbursements. There has been a change in the grant and foundation budget, did not budget and spent more due to not knowing how much we were going to get. Currently over budget for Critical Weather but Sunrise Powerlink is set aside for that and it will be reimbursed. Strike Team is over budget, State will cover, just waiting on reimbursements. Sprinkler system was over budget due to water leak, and expecting another bill due to additional work needed. Currently over budget on Election from the county requesting a higher down payment for COVID-19, possible to see some of that money come back.

6.2 – Fire Chief (pg. 36)

Fire Chief Boggeln gave a COVID-19 update. PPE supply is doing ok. OSHA required emergency regulations with enhanced safety protocols. 46% of safety personnel have received the first dose of the vaccine with the second dose starting next week. 2 personnel have gone through training to be vaccinators, one has completed the training and has been doing vaccinations with Cal Fire, and the other is in the process of completing training. One personnel is COVID positive and is isolating at home. This month Chief Boggeln was appointed Treasurer of the San Diego County Fire Chiefs Association. Fire Marshal McBroom was appointed a 2 year term with the Office of State Fire Marshal on the Automatic Extinguishing Systems Board. Fire Chief thanked Firefighter Hiebing for his



help with the successful Toy Drive. Reminded Directors to complete their direct deposit forms due to mail disappearing as well as mail theft in Alpine.

6.3 – Fire Marshal

Fire Marshal McBroom gave a FEMA grant update. They are fast tracking through local and federal regulations in the process of shortening the 3 month window possibly within the next month. Second term with the Office of State Fire Marshal will end in 2022. Director Willis asked if chipping is still in effect and Fire Marshal confirmed it is. Late March/Early April will starting looking for seasonal weed abatement inspector to start in May. 6.4 – Association of Alpine Firefighters - Local 2638

Firefighter Shane Ozbirn reported that Firefighter Lavigne received the Firefighter of The Year reward. One firefighter is out from COVID-19, spoke with him that morning and said he is doing well. Thanked Firefighter Hiebing for his efforts with the Toy Drive, and glad to see proceeds benefit Alpine families. Board thanked Firefighter Lavigne on his reward. 6.5 – Committee Reports

Subject: Board of Director Compensation



#### **BACKGROUND:**

At the January 2021 Regular Board of Directors, Director Price requested information on Board of Directors compensation. The Board has previously adopted resolutions (see attached) in 2001 and 2006 establishing Board of Director compensation at \$100 per regular board meeting.

### **DISCUSSION:**

Board member compensation is codified in Section 13857 of the Fire Protection District Law of 1987. This section was last updated in 2019 and reads as follows:

- (a) Subject to subdivision (b), each member of the district board may receive compensation in an amount set by the district board not to exceed one hundred dollars (\$100) for attending each meeting of the district board. The number of meetings for which a member of the board of directors may receive compensation shall not exceed six meetings in any calendar month. Commencing January 1, 2019, if the district compensates its members for more than four meetings in a calendar month, the district board shall annually adopt a written policy describing, based on a finding supported by substantial evidence, why more than four meetings per month are necessary for the effective operation of the district.
- (b) The district board, by ordinance adopted pursuant to Chapter 2 (commencing with Section 20200) of Division 10 of the Water Code, may increase the compensation received by the district board members above the amount prescribed by subdivision (a).
- (c) For purposes of this section, the determination of whether a director's activities on any specific day are compensable shall be made pursuant to Article 2.3 (commencing with Section 53232) of Chapter 2 of Part 1 of Division 2 of Title 5 of the Government Code. (Amended by Stats. 2018, Ch. 170, Sec. 2. (AB 2329) Effective January 1, 2019.)

Section 13857(b) authorizes the District Board to adopt, by ordinance, Chapter 2, Section 20200, of Division 10 of the Water Code. This section of the Water Code also sets compensation at \$100 per meeting but allows for, by an ordinance adoption, the option for the Board to increase the compensation to not exceed 5% for each calendar year following the operative date of the last adjustment.

# A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE ALPINE FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT ESTABLISHING PER MEETING PAYMENT AND EXPENSE REIMBURSEMENT TO DIRECTORS AND ADOPTION OF ETHICS TRAINING REQUIREMENTS

#### **RESOLUTION # 06/07-03**

WHEREAS, Health & Safety Code Section 13857 provides that the Board of Directors of a Fire District may authorize each director to receive compensation not to exceed one hundred dollars (\$100.00) per meeting and not to exceed four (4) meetings in any calendar month: and

**WHEREAS**, the Board desires to authorize such payment as provided herein and in accordance with the provisions of the Health & Safety Code; in recognition of the fact that attendance by a Director at Board meetings is of great benefit to the District.

**WHEREAS**, Government Code Section 53232.3 requires that local agencies providing expense reimbursement provide expense report forms and further requires that members receiving reimbursements timely file and document their expenses in expense reports.

WHEREAS, Government Code Section 53232.3 requires that Directors provide a brief report to the Board at the first meeting following the incurrence of a reimbursed expense and ethics training for officials representing local agencies which compensate or reimburse their members.

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Board of Directors of Alpine Fire Protection District as follows:

- 1. Each Board member shall receive compensation in the amount of \$100 for attendance at any of the following events on behalf of the District, provided that such compensation shall not exceed one (1) meeting in any calendar month;
  - a) Regular Board meetings
  - b) Special Board meetings
  - c) Advisory or committee body meetings
  - d) Any other activity the Board requests in writing a member attend in advance of attendance
- 2. Actual and necessary expenses shall be reimbursed to members when they are acting on behalf of the District in attending any of the occurrences listed in Paragraph 1. In order to qualify for this reimbursement the member must promptly submit receipts as well as the prompt filing of a District expense report after the expense is incurred and five days before the first regular meeting of the Board following the event.
- 3. Staff will include a footnote in the District expense report stating the member/s seeking reimbursement and nature of the meeting which created the expense. Additionally, as practice the person submitting the District expenses for Board review will note the inclusion of reimbursement footnotes for inclusion in the meeting minutes.
- **4.** In those limited situations where the expense report has not been filed before the next regular meeting of the board, in order to comply with Government Code Section

53235 the member seeking reimbursement will provide a statement to the effect that they will be seeking reimbursement for expenses and the nature of the occurrence which created the expense.

- 5. Lodging reimbursement in association with conferences shall be limited to the sponsor's group rate, if that rate is available at the time of booking.
- 6. Members seeking reimbursement shall seek out group and/or government rates as a first choice and reimbursements will be limited to the amount allowed by IRS publication 463. If the IRS publication fails to list a rate or reimbursement for an expense, or if the member seeks an amount greater than the IRS rate, the Board must approve the rate in writing prior to the occurrence of the expense.
- 7. Members whose current term of office expires after January 1, 2007, will attend two hours of ethics training prior to January 1, 2007, and biannually thereafter at the expense of the District. Additionally, both the District and the Director shall keep a written record of their attendance at such training.
- 8. This action of the Board shall be effective as of January 1, 2006, and shall remain in force until rescinded.

### 1002 - DIRECTOR REMUNERATION AND REIMBURSEMENT

### 1002.01 - Director Compensation

The District shall reimburse Directors at the rate of \$100.00 per meeting for all regularly scheduled board meetings, all special board meetings, and emergency board meetings. Director compensation is capped at four meetings per month.

Directors are not eligible for health, dental, or vision benefits. Directors also are not eligible for retirement benefits through CalPERS.

### 1002.02 - Director Reimbursement

Directors shall be reimbursed for all legitimate expenses incurred in attending any meetings or in making any trips on official business of the Board when so authorized by this Policy and GSA limits as well as providing all required supporting documentation.

### 1002.02 (a)

Attendance by Directors at seminars, workshops, courses, professional organization meetings, and conferences shall be approved by the Board prior to incurring any reimbursable costs and must be budgeted for in the fiscal year incurred.

### 1002.02 (b)

It is the policy of the District to encourage Board development and excellence of performance by reimbursing reasonable expenses incurred for tuition, travel, lodging and meals as a result of training, educational courses, participation with professional organizations, and attendance at local, state and national conferences associated with the interests of the District.

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### **INTRODUCTION**

The community of Alpine began as a stage stop for the mines in the Cuyamaca Mountains. In 1887, Benjamin R. Arnold, seeking a place to cure his asthma, arrived in Alpine. His health improved and he built the family home in what is today the town center. Alpine gained publicity during World War II when a U.S. Government survey declared Alpine's climate as the best in the nation. "Best Climate in the U.S.A. by Government Report" became the town slogan. Alpine's elevation ranges from 1,800 to 2,600 feet and the town encompasses 37.10 square miles. Interstate 8, a major thoroughfare for travelers and transportation of goods, runs through the district for approximately 7 miles. The San Diego Association of Governments (SANDAG) listed the population as recorded in 2010 census, dated April 1, 2010 as 17,087 with a predicted 44% increase by the year 2040.

The Alpine Fire Protection District (the "District) was founded in 1948 and officially originated on December 19, 1957. Located in the unincorporated area of eastern San Diego County, the District has one fire station staffed by 12 full time paid firefighters, divided into three divisions, who provide advanced life support, fire suppression, community risk reduction and support functions to the community.

The District's operations and services are funded from: a fraction of *ad valorem* property taxes; the fire suppression and emergency services special benefit tax; and other miscellaneous sources.

### **ALPINE SPECIAL BENEFIT TAX**

The Fire Suppression and Emergency Services Special Benefit Tax for the Alpine area (the "Alpine Special Benefit Tax") was created after it received a majority of votes at a special election held on November 6, 2001, within the boundaries of the Alpine Fire Protection District in the community of Alpine.

# RATES AND SPECIAL BENEFIT TAX METHODS OF APPORTIONMENT

The special benefit taxes are levied each year on each taxable parcel of land within its respective boundaries within the Alpine Fire Protection District at the annual rates shown in the following tables.

### ALPINE SPECIAL BENEFIT TAX

The passage of the Alpine Special Benefit Tax by the Alpine voters on November 6, 2001 authorized the District to levy the special benefit tax at a rate of \$15.00 per benefit unit as described in the table below. In order to help assure that the revenues from the Alpine Special Benefit tax grow in line with inflation and the cost of providing local fire protection and emergency medical services, the tax rate may be adjusted each year based in the increase in consumer price index for the San Diego Area ("CPI") as determined by the United States Department of Labor as approved by the voters in November 2001. The following table shows the rates to be used for fiscal year 2020/21. During the annual Board review, an increase of 2.4% was approved and adopted which reflects the annual change in CPI as of February 18, 2020.

### SPECIAL TAX - FISCAL YEAR 2020-2021

In general, revenue from the special benefit taxes for fiscal year 2020-2021 property tax collections will be used to fund local fire suppression, protection and emergency medical services in the District. The District's services provided comprise the following:

### EMERGENCY RESPONSE

Mitigate fire or explosion, medical emergencies, rescue, hazardous material spills and hazardous material spills.

#### DISASTER PREPAREDNESS

Maintenance and coordination of the District's Disaster Preparedness Program

### PUBLIC ASSISTANCE

Respond to request for service from the public when those services are not otherwise assigned to other public agencies.

### LOSS PREVENTION

Programs that include the implementation and enforcement of fire and life safety regulations and laws.

### • PUBLIC EDUCATION and INFORMATION

Programs to prepare the citizens of the District to better prevent and mitigate emergencies.

#### ADMINISTRATION

Administration and overhead costs.

More specifically, the Alpine Special Benefit Tax fund operating expenses, capital improvement expenditures, debt repayment and long-term capital accrual in order to provide local fire suppression and emergency services.

### SPECIAL TAX ANNUAL REPORTING

Senate Bill 165, filed with the Secretary of State on September 19, 2000, enacted the Local Agency Special Tax and Bond Accountability Act. This Act requires that any local special tax or local bond measure subject to voter approval contain a statement indicating the specific purposes of the special tax, require that the proceeds of the special tax be applied to those purposes, require the creation of a fund account into which the proceeds shall be deposited, and require an annual report containing specified information concerning the use of the proceeds. The Act only applies to any local special tax measure or local bond measure adopted on or after January 1, 2001 in accordance with Section 50075.1, 50075.3, 50075.5 and Section 53410 of the California Government Code.

Some of the requirements of the Act are handled at the formation of the Special Tax District and others are handled through annual reports. This report intends to comply with Section 50075.3 or Section 53411 of the California Government Code that states:

The "Chief Fiscal Officer" of the issuing local agency shall file a report with its governing body no later than January 1, 2002, and at least once a year thereafter. The annual report shall contain all of the following:

- a) The amount of funds collected and expended.
- b) The status of any project required or authorized to be funded as identified in subdivision (a) of Section 50075.1 or Section 53410."

### **ADMINISTRATION OF SPECIAL TAXES**

### **GENERAL ADMINISTRATIVE REQUIREMENTS**

The special benefit tax levy is calculated for all parcels on the new fiscal year's assessor roll. This roll includes all parcels that are in existence prior to January 1 of the previous fiscal year. After the special tax levies have been computed, the levy data must be filed with the County Auditor prior to August 10 of each year for inclusion on property tax bills.

After submission of the parcel tax levies, the final levies should be confirmed with the County Auditor prior to the preparation of tax bills, which typically occurs in October. The special tax is collected in two equal installments on the tax bills that are due on December 10 and April 10.

### **USE OF PROCEEDS**

All proceeds of the special benefit tax levied and imposed shall be accounted for and paid into a special account for the special benefit tax designated for use of operations and maintenance of the District.

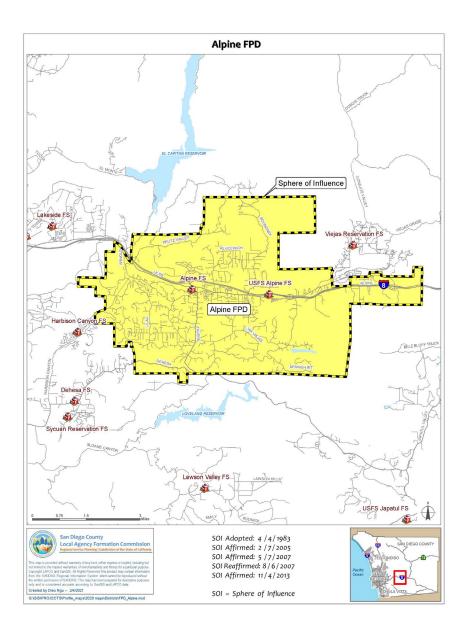

### **SUBJECT SUMMARY:**

Discussion and possible action to determine if the Board will approve and adopt an increase in the Benefit Fee for FY 21/22.

### **BACKGROUND:**

The benefit fee was voted on and approved by the citizens of this District in November 6, 2001. Resolution 01/02-2, Section 4 allows for an annual CPI increase equal to the adjusted Consumer Price Index measured between January 1 of the immediately preceding fiscal year and the preceding January 1 (1/20 - 1/21) as determined for the San Diego area by the U.S. Department of Labor. The chart below shows the previous ten years of board action.

### AB 361 - Brown Act: Remote Meetings During Emergencies

#### **SUMMARY**

As amended, Assembly Bill 361 will provide additional flexibility for local city councils, boards, commissions, and other agencies to meet remotely via video and teleconference during a local emergency that makes meeting in person unsafe, while still maintaining high levels of public access and transparency. This legislation will not allow local agencies to meet remotely during emergencies that would not prevent the local agency board from meeting in person, nor will this legislation create any new authorization for a local agency to declare a local emergency.

#### **BACKGROUND**

In 1953, the Ralph M. Brown Act, known simply as the "Brown Act" ever since, guaranteed the public's right to attend and participate in meetings of local legislative bodies. To meet this objective, the Brown Act drew up requirements regarding public notices of meetings, the posting of agendas, and physical access to those meetings.

In 1988, AB 3191 (Frazee) updated the Brown Act by authorizing local legislative bodies to use video teleconferencing in connection with any meeting or proceeding authorized by law, for the benefit of the public. However, AB 3191 also required that the public had to have physical access to each remote meeting location. Subsequently, in 1998, SB 138 (Kopp) expanded the allowable uses of teleconferencing even further.

When the COVID-19 pandemic started, local agency boards struggled to conduct their meetings in compliance with the Brown Act's public accessibility requirements while still abiding by stay-at-home orders. As a result, Governor Newsom signed Orders N-25-20, N-29-20, and N-35-20 to grant local agencies the flexibility to meet remotely during the COVID-19 pandemic.

#### **PROBLEM**

The Governor's executive orders allowed public agencies to meet remotely and did not require physical public access to those meeting locations. Unfortunately, those Executive Orders only apply to the current health pandemic and do not contemplate future health, fire, flood, or other unforeseen emergencies.

#### **SOLUTION**

AB 361 will provide additional flexibility for local agencies looking to meet remotely in order to continue providing the public with essential services during a proclaimed state of emergency or local emergency. In doing so, local agency boards will not have to rely on an Executive Order from the Governor.

While maintaining high standards of public transparency and access, AB 361 will allow public agencies to meet remotely to continue providing services to the public without jeopardizing the safety of the public, local agency personnel, or board members. Local agencies will accommodate both internet video conferencing platforms and phone lines to ensure that the public can access these meetings with or without an internet connection. This means that if a specified state or local emergency is declared, a local city council would be allowed to meet via a videoconferencing platform and/or phone. The public would be able to participate through such online and telephonic platforms, too.

Most importantly, if a meeting could still be held in-person without endangering local agency board members or personnel, then the local agency will not be entitled to meet remotely.

Local agencies looking to meet remotely pursuant to these provisions will have to do so in accordance with a locally declared emergency or an emergency declared by the Governor of California. A local emergency could include a toxic leak or wildfire evacuation that inhibits the local body from meeting in person. Together, these important provisions will provide local agencies with the flexibility necessary to meet remotely while preserving public access during a specified emergency.

RE: Assembly Bill 361 (Rivas) - Support As Introduced

Dear Assembly Member Rivas:

The Alpine Fire Protection District is pleased to support your Assembly Bill 361, related to the Ralph M. Brown Act ("the Brown Act").

In light of a stay-at-home order and the need to keep individuals physically distanced from one another, Governor Newsom issued a number of subsequent executive orders (N-25-20, N-29-20, N-35-20) modifying the requirements of the Brown Act. AB 361 seeks to codify several provisions from within the executive orders.

AB 361 would allow local agencies to safely meet remotely during an emergency. The changes to law included in AB 361 are what have allowed local agencies to continue to operate while also complying with important public health directives issued by officials during the COVID-19 pandemic; by enshrining these provisions in statute, this bill ensures that local agencies would continue to be able to remain safe in future emergencies that threaten public health.

AB 361 will include important safeguards that ensure public agency transparency and public access. For a public agency to utilize these provisions to meet remotely, a local agency must meet subsequent or concurrent to a proclaimed state of emergency or declared local emergency, and declare that the nature of the emergency would prevent them from safely meeting in-person. This bill would specifically prohibit local agencies from requiring members of the public to submit their comments in advance, guaranteeing that the public has the opportunity to observe and offer comment during the meeting.

For these reasons, the Alpine Fire Protection District is pleased to support Assembly Bill 361 (Rivas). Please feel free to contact us if you have any questions.

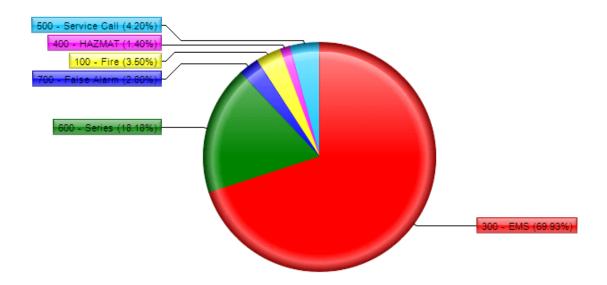
