1. Fire Chief (pg. 36)

Fire Chief Boggeln gave an update on COVID-19 with there being no change. He gave a reminder that the living quarters side of the station is still closed to the public and if you need to meet with the firefighters to do so in the lobby or the offices. Chief Boggeln ran a report and stating that there has been 5,700 personnel hours since June 1st related to strike team or critical weather, compared to last year which had 1,500 hours. \$220,000 has been used for the overhead strike teams but will be reimbursed along with a 28% administrative fee accrual. SDFF contacted Chief Boggeln with a donor wanting to donate money for the Valley Fire and local fires to fire agencies that may have had equipment damage. They will be donating \$2,500 which will go towards replacing the wildland jackets.

2. Fire Marshal – September 2020 (pg. 37)

Fire Marshal McBroom gave a grant update that was submitted through Fire Prevention from the County Fire Foundation. Applied for this grant last year and was rewarded \$6,700, and this year was rewarded \$11,500. It has been spent on fire prevention gratuities for the next 2-3 years for open houses and things to involve the community.

Firefighter Shane Ozbirn thanked the foundation for donating \$8,500 for station needs, which went to TV's, kitchen appliances, etc. Local 2638 will be participating in Octoberstash, which is a nonprofit charity to raise money for families in need. This year the funds will go to an El Cajon employee who was in a debilitating car accident.

SUMMARY DESCRIPTION

Under direction and supervision of the Fire Chief, the Administrative Assistant is responsible for performing complex administrative support activities requiring confidentiality and regularly exercise discretion and independent judgement; assist senior management by assuming a variety of administrative duties; interacts with members of the public and other government agencies and answers and routes telephone calls. The Administrative Assistant may be assigned specialized work or special projects involving a variety of complex and highly responsible secretarial tasks and highly technical and non-routine duties of an administrative nature which will require independent judgement. The Administrative Assistant will be required to attend board meetings and may be asked to attend other major business meetings.

REPRESENTATIVE DUTIES

The following duties are typical for this classification. Incumbents may not perform all of the listed duties and/or may be required to perform additional or different duties from those set forth below to address business needs and changing business practices.

- Administrative support and clerical procedures and systems such as word processing, managing files and records, designing forms, and other office procedures and terminology.

Environment:

Work is performed in a general office environment during routine office hours, however evening and weekend work is possible. Work activities vary widely including attendance at meetings, classroom training, and driving. This position involved periods of prolonged sitting and use of computer equipment. This position requires the physical and mental capabilities to read information printed on paper and displayed on computer monitors; hear, speak, and communicate verbally using the English language; cognitive thinking and mathematical calculation capabilities; manual dexterity to manipulate papers, files, financial records, 10-key, mouse, and telephone.

CONSTANT upward and downward flexion of neck, side-to-side turning of neck; simple grasping and repetitive use of hands to hold radios, equipment and property; fine finger dexterity to manipulate apparatus controls, computer keyboard and writing utensils; lifting and carrying of objects weighing up to 10 lbs. **FREQUENT** walking, standing, sitting, kneeling, climbing, balancing and squatting; bending and twisting at the waist; pushing, pulling and reaching above and below shoulder level; power grasping; walking on uneven ground; driving; lifting and carrying of objects
